

NAME

bbcpc — bare-bones copy a file

SYNOPSIS

bbcpc *source target*

DESCRIPTION

The **bbcpc** utility copies the contents of the *source* to *target*.

If *target* is a directory, **bbcpc** will copy *source* into this directory.

EXAMPLES

The following examples show common usage:

```
bbcpc file1 file2
```

```
bbcpc file1 dir
```

```
bbcpc file1 dir/file2
```

```
bbcpc file1 dir/subdir/subsubdir/file2
```

EXIT STATUS

bbcpc exits 0 on success, and >0 if an error occurred.

The code for the **bbcpc** utility is, of course, well-formatted according to the guidelines found at <https://stevens.netmeister.org/631/style>. The program can be compiled using the `-Wall` and `-Werror` flags without any errors or warnings on a NetBSD 9.x system.
